DANCE PERFORMANCE, EUROPEAN

Individual or group entries. An original dance (by entrant or other) may be used if it is completely authentic in style. Choreography will not be judged; interpretation and alteration of a given choreography will be judged.

DOCUMENTATION (0-30 points. SCORED 0-10 then MULTIPLY BY 3): Must have at least "EZ Doc" information. More is acceptable, although one or two pages (not counting visuals and bibliography) should be more than enough. If your documentation is more than three pages for exceptionally detailed and in-depth work, you should provide an executive summary. The best documentation will cover what they did in period, what the creator did in the project, and why the difference (if any). It will explain any conscious compromises made, and provide footnotes, illustrations, and references, as well as any original research or experimentation as it applies to the project. Give score based on the following considerations:

- A minimum of: what it is, where is it from, when is it from, and references;
- Materials used in the project;
- Techniques and tools used during the process;
- Research (country, period of origin, typical characteristics, etc.), visual references (books, portraits, etc.) from reliable sources;
- Artistic design, i.e. the relationship between various elements (steps, music, costume, etc.); as well as context in which dance would be performed; explanation of any theme, influence of garb, social class, etc. on performance.

AUTHENTICITY (0-20 points) [SCORE 0-10 and then DOUBLE THE SCORE]:

- 0-2: Dance choreography and/or performance style not period;
- 3-4: Mixes period and non-period elements, or mixes incompatible styles;
- 5-6: Basically period, with minor inconsistencies (Ex. incorrect handholds);
- 7-8: Authentic not only in steps and figures, but also in music and details such as posture, handholds and mood of dance (solemn, flirtatious, etc.);
- 9-10: Special effort taken to create a completely period impression: Ex. appropriate garb, live music, etc.

<u>COMPLEXITY (1-10 points)</u>: Rank the ambition of the entry, not the workmanship considering the following:

- Variety of steps and figures;
- Difficulty of steps and figures;
- Difficulty of speed and timing;
- Difficulty of theme or mood;
- Use of props, special garb, mime, other added elements;
- Scope of endeavor (length, number of people, etc.).

<u>PERFORMANCE replaces "WORKMANSHIP" on the score sheet. (3-30 points. SCORE 1-10 then MULTIPLY BY 3)</u>: Rank the quality of execution (performance) and success of the entry on a scale of 1-10 considering the following:

- Knowledge of dance (accuracy, confidence);
- Timing;
- Spacing;
- Proper execution of steps, including precision and grace;
- Development of theme or mood, audience awareness, showmanship.

OVERALL IMPRESSION (1-10 points): Evaluate the work as a whole, rating the complete effect and appeal beyond Atlantia

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
